

L'Œuvre Ouverte : An Open Source Electronic Art
International Festival in Montreal

Montreal, August 7th - The 2nd international PureData convention, held in Montreal from the 21st to the 26th of August 2007 will animate the city's electronic art scene. The Society for Art and Technology [SAT], McGill and Concordia universities, Oboro and StudioXX will be the hosts of this gathering of the PureData Free and Open Source Software art community.

L'Œuvre ouverte will include the work of more than seventy artists, musicians, developers and theoreticians from over 10 countries, much of which will be seen in Montreal for the first time. The event is organized by the **PureData Convention Collective** with the help of the Montreal Pure Data community, one of the most prominent and active Free and Open Source Software art community in the world.

With a rich program including installations, audio-visual performances, conferences and workshops, **L'Œuvre ouverte | PureData Convention '07** will be a great opportunity to experience Free and Open Source electronic art culture and meet the communities that surround it.

THE EXHIBITIONS

The central exhibition site, on the main and lower floors of the SAT, will house nine installations selected by curator Marc Fournel and the Convention's artistic committee. Each of these multimedia installations integrates the PureData programming language. Some artists such as Lorena Salomé (CA), with **Untitled (solenoids)-v2**, and Erki De Vries & Tim Vets (BE), with **Poltergeist**, use the software to control motorized objects while others such as Ben Bogart (CA), creator of **SOOS1 (Self-Other Organizing Structure #1)**, uses it to modulate image and audio content. The two above mentioned works are installed in the front windows of the SAT, visible from the street. **Unité 1**, an interactive sound installation by Jérôme Abel (FR) is presented in the Parc de la Paix, next to the SAT, on St. Laurent Boulevard. The exhibition will be open from the 22nd to the 26th of August. The opening is on Wednesday August 22nd, at 7pm, at the SAT.

Parallel to the main exhibition, Videographe presents **Auditory Tactics**, by Philippe-Aubert Gauthier and Philippe Pasquier. This public art work is a interactive sound installation consisting of a network of sixteen speakers which allow for audio beams to be controlled, creating a spatialization effect. The work is situated in the hallway on the main floor of Concordia University's EV building, at the corner of Guy and St. Catherine streets. This exhibition will be open from August 22nd to September 22nd, 2007. The opening will take place on Wednesday August 22nd, at 5pm.

THE PERFORMANCES

During the evenings of August 21st, 22nd and 24th, at the SAT café, **L'Œuvre ouverte** will present nine sound and multimedia performances. Performers, such as Dan Wilcox (USA), creator of **Robotcowboy** and Georg Holzmann (AT), creator of **The Electronic Unicorn**, work as both musicians and electronic instrument makers and build their own interactive and wearable interfaces. These two performances will be presented on August 21st, at 9pm. On the 22nd of August, Montreal artists Thomas Ouellet Fredericks and Danny Perreault will present **Tvestroy**, an electrovideoacoustic performance that makes use of televisions to generate sound and images. On the same evening, the legendary Convolution Brothers (Zack Settel (CA), Cort Lippe (USA), Miller Puckette(USA)) will unload their frequencies by presenting the **Convo. Bro's Guide to Live Performance**. On Friday August 24th, at 9pm, **L'Œuvre ouverte** will present Sven König's (SUI) mindblowing performance **sCrAmBlEd?HaCkZ!** and Frank Barnecht's (DE) performance **Faltig**, as well as **Music for Solo Performer** (Alvin Lucier 1965), a piece performed by Maxime de la Rochefoucauld (CA) and Andrew Brouse (CA), that transforms EEG signals from the human brain to create new sounds and compositions. Entry to all performances costs 5\$ at the door and is free of charge for those registered for the convention.

In addition to this series of performances, **Takeover** by Tristan John Evans (UK) with pianist Pamela Reimer, will be presented on Wednesday August 22nd, at 1pm, at Tanna Schulich Concert Hall of McGill University's School of Music. This score for this work has been composed with the aid of a computer.

THE CONFERENCES

Over 25 conferences will be presented at McGill University between the 22nd and 25th of August. The presentations, divided into six sections, have been selected by an international jury coordinated by Andrew Brouse. The first three days of conferences will be presented at Tanna Schulich Concert Hall under the themes of: Performative Strategies and Art Aesthetics Theory [August 22nd]; Core Hardware and Software [August 23rd]; Virtual Environments and Extensions to PureData [August 24th]. The final day of the conferences, addressing the theme of Generating and Managing Complexity [August 25th], will take place at McGill University's Pollack Hall.

The **PureData Convention 07** will be opened on the 21st of August by keynote speaker Miller Puckett, the initiator of PureData, who will present the current state of the arts of the software and its community. During the Convention, participants will have the opportunity to attend presentations including those by IOhannes M Zmölzig (AT) on collaborative programming with PureData, by Alejandra Maria Perez Nunez (CL) on PureData as a feminist tool for meaningful learning and by Edward Kelly (UK) on a new approach to polyphony in PureData.

THE WORKSHOPS

The **PureData Convention's** seven workshops will be hosted at Oboro and StudioXX, local artist run centers situated at 4001 Berri street. Open to convention participants, these practical workshops present diverse techniques and tools for PureData. Bobbi Kosniuk (CA) will present a workshop on the use of sensors data and USB devices. As well, three active members of Pdmtl (our regional PureData users group); Patrick Coulombe, Alexandre Quessy and Thomas Ouellet Fredericks will present the PD MTL library of abstractions.

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

The **PureData Convention 07** will also present a number of special activities such as roundtable discussions and a "coding spree", a collective programming gathering in the SAT café, on August 25th, from 1:30-7pm. From 1pm to 9pm on the same day, the public is invited to visit the installations and meet with the artists and the curator of the **L'Œuvre ouverte** exhibition. On the evening of August 25th, all are invited to the closing party at Espace B, 6545 Durocher avenue, Suite 401. The entrance price is 5\$ at the door and free for those registered for the Convention.

In addition to these activities, the Convention will co-host special editions of local monthly gatherings. **ShareMTL** will be presented on the 23rd of August at 8pm in the Parc de la Paix, next to the SAT. **MixSessions** will take place following the ShareMTL event on the 23rd of August from 11pm to 2am at the SAT. **Dorkbot** will be held on Saturday, August 25th from 3pm to 5pm at the SAT.
